Exchange Program Overview

The exchange program at MTSU is administered by the Office of Education Abroad.

To apply for the program, students must be nominated by one of MTSU's exchange partner institutions before the appropriate deadline for the desired term of study.

English Proficiency Requirements*

- IELTS—5.5 or above
- TOEFL iBT—61 or above
- TOEFL (computer-based)— 173 or above
- TOEFL (paper-based)—
 500 or above

*Proof of English proficiency is not required for exchange students from countries whose official language is English.

All exchange students will apply for a J-1 visa to study at MTSU.

Estimated Living Costs (per semester):

• Tuition: Exchange students do not pay tuition to MTSU

• Housing*: \$2,700–\$3,500

• Meals*: \$1,500-\$2,100

• Books and supplies: \$500-\$1,000

• Health Insurance: \$400–\$600

• Personal Expenses: \$1,000–\$2,000

*Housing and meals fees may be waived depending on the exchange agreement.

calendar year: October 1


About MTSU

Academics

Campus Recreation

Access to MTSU's Campus Recreation Center is free for students. The facility features:

Student Health Services

Students are eligible to take advantage of the many services

available at the health clinic on campus, including wellness visits, immunizations, or nutritional counseling. MTSU also has a pharmacy where students can fill prescription medications or purchase over-the-counter products.

The James E. Walker Library is one of the most popular study spots. In addition to print materials, students have access to various online databases. The library is home to computer labs, a digital media studio, a writing center, and tutoring services.

Accommodations

Exchange students are encouraged to apply for on-campus housing.
