APPLICATION MATERIALS AND DEADLINES

All nominated students will receive an email from our office that contains an undergraduate or graduate application for admission. Please note: The graduate application is only for students who plan to enroll in graduate-level courses.

All application materials should be submitted to the Office of Education Abroad **only** by the following priority application deadlines:

<u>Please note: Immunization requirements are not flexible</u>. Exchange students are required to show proof of at least one varicella vaccination and one MMR vaccination, OR have a titer(s) confirming immunity, OR had disease(s) confirmed by medical record; as indicated on the application health form signed by their health care provider PRIOR to full admittance to the exchange program.

COURSE SELECTION	
Course information	 <u>https://ssb.mtsu.edu/pls/PROD/bwckschd.p_disp_dyn_sched</u> Students should pay special attention to course prerequisites when selecting courses If the term is not available, students should use the corresponding term for the best list (i.e. use spring for spring) The Exchange Student Academic Advisor will make every effort to assist students through the course registration process. Students should be very flexible regarding course selection and should have several alternative courses chosen in case their original courses are closed. In addition, exchange students will be provided with permissions to enroll in the specific courses they have requested. Should students change their courses after arrival, they will be directly responsible for requesting permissions directly with the Academic Departments.

TRANSCRIPTS	
	Transcripts will be mailed to the home university 4-6 weeks after the program ends.
Mailing	Students are responsible for submitting a Transcript Request form to the Office of Education Abroad in order for the transcript to be mailed. This form will be provided to each student during orientation.
	Students may also request an unofficial transcript after the term ends via their student account.

HOUSING	
	Most exchange students live in on-campus housing. The Global Learning Community (GLC) and Womack Apartments (full-year students, full exchange only) are the most common options for exchange students.
Туре	Students who want to live on-campus during the winter break (or for those where winter break housing is part of the exchange agreement) must live in Womack Apartments. With most exchange partnerships, there is an additional cost for the winter break housing. There are very few single rooms on campus. Students should expect to have a roommate.
Placement	Students should be aware they may be placed into any on-campus housing space after submitting the housing application and cannot cancel it.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

Exchange students will be contacted in advance regarding the required health insurance options.

Students participating on an ISEP Exchange Program at MTSU will be enrolled in health insurance through ISEP. Those students are required to provide proof of ISEP insurance enrollment and do not need to enroll in additional insurance, as listed below.

	Current health insurance options include:
Health Insurance Options	 Enrollment into health insurance in the home country which meets or exceeds the U.S. Department of State health insurance requirements for J-1 visa holders (information provided to students at a later date), OR
	Enrollment into a Global Adventure health insurance plan through iNext, OR
	 Students who fail to provide proof of adequate health insurance via one of these options will be automatically enrolled into the MTSU health insurance at a cost to the student.

ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Students will be contacted in advance regarding recommended shuttle services to campus. The most common options include shuttle, Uber, Lyft, and Taxi.

The Nashville Airport (BNA) is approximately 25 miles from the MTSU campus. The cost for a shuttle one-way is approximately \$40 per person, plus a small tip of approximately \$2-5. Payment is made to the shuttle company and reservations are required.

Students can use Uber or Lyft for approximately the same cost as the shuttle.

INTERNATIONAL BUDDY PROGRAM

Students admitted to the university under the exchange program will have an opportunity to join the International Buddy Program.

This program connects current MTSU students, many of whom have studied abroad, with incoming exchange students to welcome them to campus, provide support before and after arrival to MTSU, and to facilitate cultural exchange. In addition to exchange students having a campus resource for academics and campus life, lifelong friendships have formed through this program. We encourage all students to participate!

Admitted exchange students will receive an email from the Office of Education Abroad about the program.
